Image Types

- GIF Graphics Interchange Format
 - 256 colors, small, and can include animations and transparency
 - good for logos or other symbols
- PNG Portable Network Graphics
 - 16 million colors, transparency, and lossless compression
- JPG or JPEG Joint Photographics Expert Group
 - lossy compression, great for photographs
- SVG Scalable Vector Graphics
 - XML format of shapes, colors, and lines
 - shrink and grow

- The tag does not have a close.
- Must contain src and alt attributes
 - src Source file name May include a path to another folder
 - alt alternate text if the image is not available and for non visual users.
 - May be empty ""
