Phrasing – Simple Tags

- ... - Emphasis
- ... - Mark Utilitarian Words (products, keywords, actions...)
- ... - Strong Importance or Urgent Text
- <mark>...</mark> - Generic Marked Text
- <small>...</small> - Small Print
(legal disclaimers, copyrights, ...)
- <i>...</i> - Offset in a Different Voice

<cite>Animal Farm</cite> by George Orwell
```

```
<p>An <dfn>orange</dfn> is a citrus fruit</p>
```

```
<abbr title="Shawnee State University">SSU</abbr>
```

```
<q cite="https://en.wikiquote.org/wiki/Douglas_Adams">Don't  
Panic</q>
```

- cite – The title of a work.
- dfn – The paragraph or article defines this term
- abbr – title attribute with the full term
- q – Quotation (optional cite attribute)
