Basic Syntax of Style

- For Internal and External CSS
- Selector – rule to match HTML tags
- Followed by { } (Curly Braces)
- Style inside { }
- Many Styles, many selectors
- May have comments
`/* stuff */`

```
selector {  
    style: value;  
    . . .  
}  
  
. . .  
/* comment */  
  
. . .
```

Style Tag

```
<style>  
  /* selectors and style go here */  
</style>
```

- Add this to the `<head> . . . </head>`
- Can be multiple lines long
- Applies these selectors to the entire document

HTML Tag Selector

- Use the HTML tag name as a simple selector
- Style applied to all tags of that type

```
<style>
  body {
    background-color: yellow;
  }
  h1 {
    color: green;
  }
</style>
```

<html lang="en">
  <head>
    <meta charset="utf-8">
    <title>Internal Style</title>
    <style>
      body {
        background-color: rgb(200,200,200);
      }
      h1 {
        background-color: black;
        color: white;
        font-family: Curlz MT, Tempus Sans ITC,
Fantasy;
      }
    </style>
  </head>
  <body>
    <h1>Internal Style</h1>
    <p>Paragraph of text.</p>
  </body>
</html>
```
